32 bar Strathspey for 4 couples Devised by Elaine Brunken

1 - 8 1^{st} and 2^{nd} couples and at the same time 3^{rd} and 4^{th} couples, dance a progressive figure of eight.

Progressive figure of eight

 1^{st} and 3^{rd} couple cross with Right hands, cast off one place, cross up through original place and cast to progressed place. (1's are now in 2^{nd} place, 3's in 4^{th} place, while 2^{nd} and 4^{th} couple Set, cross up, cast off, through original place, and cross up to progressed places. (2's are now in 1^{st} position, and 4's in 3^{rd} place,) All finish on own side, 1^{st} and 3^{rd} couple face in, 2^{nd} and 4^{th} couple face out

- 9 16 <u>Mirror reels</u> of four, RIGHT shoulder on the Ladies side, LEFT shoulder on the men's side
- 17 20 1st and 2nd couples, and 3rd and 4th couples (top and bottom) Set and Link.
- 21 24 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} couple (middle couples) Set and Link Finish in order 1,3,2,4

All Set.

25 - 26

- 27 30 All turn partners with two hands, twice around to finish in centre of dance, all facing down.
- 31 32 3^{rd} and 4^{th} couples cast up one place, while 1^{st} and 2^{nd} couple dance down one place and curve into place.

Repeat from new position.

Devised in honour of my grandparents, Richard Haggarty and Christina Wallace Haggarty (my Nana) who between them served nearly 40 years on West Lothians' Council. In their honour a new bridge was built between Stoneyburn and Addiwell, over the Briech Water where they used to meet while courting. The bridge is named Haggarty's Brig.
