## 32 bar Strathspey for three couples in a four-couple longwise set

| 1-4 | 1st and second couples set and, giving both hands, turn just over once round to finish in a diagonal line, 1st woman and 2nd man back to back in the middle facing their partners. |
| :---: | :---: |
| 5-8 | 1st and second couples dance a half pousette. |
| 9-16 | 1st couple dance a half diagonal reel of four with first corners, and, passing by the right shoulder, dance a half diagonal reel of four with second corners. |
| 17-24 | 1st couple dance a one couple knot: |
|  | 17-18 giving right hands, 1st couple turn halfway into allemande hold to face up. |
|  | 19-20 1st couple dance up round 3rd woman and start dancing down the men's side. |
|  | 21 releasing right hands, 1st man guides 1st woman in front of him so that they are both facing down just outside the men's side with left hands still joined. |
|  | 22 still dancing down and slightly in, 1st man guides 1st woman into the center. |
|  | 23-24 1st couple, left hands still joined, turn halfway to second place on opposite sides. |

25-28 3rd, 1st and 2nd couples set and, giving both hands, turn once round to finish on the sides facing clockwise.
29-32 3rd, 1st and 2 nd couples chase halfway to finish on own sides in the order $2,1,3$.
Repeat, having passed a couple.
Devised by Wouter Joubert, April 2019. This dance is a celebration of what binds us together; about seeing brothers and sisters instead of enemies or strangers.
